The last part of the holiday takes us to Napoli, the home of a Unesco Heritage food that is eaten and has been reinterperated all over the world - Pizza. While we take a break from golf we will have the opportunity to visit the ruins of nearby Pompeii and Herculanuem 2 roman cities that have been preserved in their destruction by Mount Vesuvius.

Here we either return to Rome for a flight back home, or we continue to San Domenico Golf Resort on the east side of Italy to join in one of the greatest Amateur experiences the playing package of the European Senior Tour The Italian Senior Open. Who will you be paired with, find out at the exclusive gala evening, and if you are good enough, you may end up playing in the final round on Sunday as one of only 15 Amateur golfers priveledged to do so.

CASTELCONTURBIA

Design: Robert Trent Jones Ranking: Italy: 4 | Europe 79

Designed by Robert Trent Jones, Castelconturbia Golf Club opened for play in 1984 to a standing ovation. It's located about one hour's drive to the north of Milan and it has bags of Italian style.

Castelconturbia is one of Italy's most challenging courses and with three nine-hole loops there are a number of playing combinations. If you want to play the Italian Open course, you'll need to play the Blue and Yellow nines (the Red course makes up the 27 holes) and, if you want to score well, you'll need to have some accurate approach shots in your armoury. The Castelconturbia greens are huge, and very difficult to read and they can be cruel with their pin placements. Let's hope the weather is kinder for your visit than it was for the 1998 Italian Open, which saw José Maria Olazábal emerge victorious.

MILAN

Milan is Italy's city of the future, a fast-paced metropolis where money talks, creativity is big business and looking good is an art form.

Ruled by the Caesars, Napoléon, the Austro-Hungarians and Mussolini, Milan has an ancient and fascinating history. After the unification of Italy in 1861, it also became an important industrial and cultural centre — a title it still holds today. While it may not have the historic attractions of other Italian cities, it holds its own with art collections old and new, which mark the genius of old masters and provoke new conversations about where the world is headed. Prestigious nights at La Scala, an illustrious literary heritage and a vibrant music scene also do much to debunk the city's workaholic image.

Cucina povera (poor man's cuisine) may be the cry of the south, but Milanese cooking is the product of a rich urban culture. Just note the golden hue of its quintessential dishes: cotoletta (burnished, buttery veal) and saffron risotto. It was in powerful commercial cities such as Milan that some of Italy's great cuisines were born, marrying Mediterranean fruits, spices and herbs with cooking methods, pastry techniques and eating styles from France and central Europe. Even today Milan continues to push Italy's culinary boundaries, making sushi and dim sum its own, and holding the highest number of Michelin stars in the country.



THE LAST SUPPER

Enjoy the Last Supper by Michelangelo followed by our own Welcome Dinner.

The convent of Santa Maria delle Grazie hosts one of the most famous attractions in the world: Leonardo da Vinci's Last Supper. Among the most famous masterpieces of Renaissance art in Italy, this is a large mural painting in which Christ announces that he will be betrayed by one of his apostles. At the end of the 15th century, Ludovico il Moro, at that time Duke of Milan, commissioned the painting from Leonardo. Leonardo began work on the Last Supper in 1496 and completed it in 1498. The somewhat lengthy time spent on the painting reflects the meticulous attention that he dedicated to his works. In fact, he experimented with an innovative pictorial technique. Rather than hastily applying a mixture of colours and water to fresh plaster, the usual technique for frescoes, he used a medium with oil and tempera which allowed him to paint not only more slowly but also directly on the wall. Unfortunately, his chosen medium doomed the painting to fade and peel, thus compromising its state of conservation. Leonardo also introduced significant innovations into the layout of the scene. In fact, for the first time in the history of art, all thirteen diners are seated on one side of a rectangular table. The central figure is Christ while the Apostles are divided up, symmetrically, into four groups of three, a representation that makes the scene even more lively and dramatic.

MODENA



FERRARI MUSEUM

This is a major exhibition celebrating the most successful Formula 1 team ever, a name that has come to symbolise motorsport, uniting a nation and millions of fans the world over in the process.

The cars featured in the exhibition at the Ferrari Museum in Maranello tell the story of a glorious career spanning over 90 years. They begin with the Alfa Romeo 8C 2300 Spider, the first car to sport the Prancing Horse in 1932, and continue all the way to the SF71H, the single-seater both Sebastian Vettel and Kimi Räikkönen drove in the 2018 World Championship.

Ferrari's motorsport adventure in the decades separating the two cars is told through unforgettable models that battled it out in gruelling races, won historic victories and sometimes endured painful defeats. All encapsulate Enzo Ferrari's dream and the commitment, determination and thirst to innovate of a team whose history is inextricably linked with that of Formula 1 itself.

31 World titles of which 15 were Drivers' and 16 Constructors' – an unmatched record that the Maranello team defends each year and honours with the very same passion as it did in its earliest days. Naturally, the exhibition pays homage to Ferrari's victories in the enclosed wheel championships too.

The semi-professional simulators are available at Musei Ferrari to give visitors a taste of the exhilaration of driving a Prancing Horse F1 single-seater in Maranello and a high-performance GT car inspired to the SF90 Stradale in Modena. They will also have a choice of some of the world's most famous circuits: Monza, Barcelona, Silverstone, Imola, Nürbürgring, Zandvoort, SPA Francorchamps and Mugello.

The cars, though very different, let the occupant feel the track surface, respond very realistically if they hit the rubbing strip, for instance, and, most importantly of all, are extraordinarily sensitive to both throttle and brake, delivering all the thrill of the speed only cars this sophisticated can deliver. But with one very important advantage: no matter how many prangs or spins you have, you'll still be able to get back on the track with no collateral damage!

EXCLUSIVE LUNCH AT THE CAVALLINO RESTAURANT

The aspirations, successes and memories that form an Integral part of ferrari history.

Cavallino has played a key part in Ferrari's history. It is a symbol of the company's deep bond with the region, through relationships and friendship made over time. It has witnessed celebrations, and the most daring challenges undertaken by the Scuderia. When Enzo Ferrari purchased the area where the manufacturing complex stands today, this farmhouse housed the company canteen. Later, in 1950, it officially became Ristorante Cavallino.

Here, Ferrari engineers stopped by for a modest lunch with their guests, close friends and collaborators. At weekends, they'd enjoy a glass of wine in front of the screen while viewing Formula 1 Grands Prix. The tables have been graced by distinguished personalities such as Prince Bernard of Holland, the Princess of Belgium Liliana de Réthy, and three-time world champion driver Jackie Stewart, as well as all the drivers and technicians who have made up the Ferrari Team over the decades. It was here that Bernie Ecclestone and Jean-Marie Balestre signed the foundations of the Formula 1 Concorde Agreement in 1981, before returning in 1987 to discuss the new competition rules with Enzo Ferrari himself. At the end of the meeting they told him, "Engineer, you write the rules."



GOLF UGOLINO

Design: Blandford and Gannon

Ranking: Italy: 23

The course was designed by an Englishman and an Irishman, Cecil Blandford and Peter Gannon. They used the natural contours of the Chianti slopes to produce an outstanding course, threaded through the indigenous vines, olive trees, maritime pines, and broom. The course is not long but demands a high degree of skill. The greens are small and well defended by bunkers. The sloping fairways also present a great challenge. To play Ugolino is not just to indulge in a game of golf, it is to wander through a landscape of great natural beauty, surrounded by olive and other fruit trees. It is an unforgettable and uplifting experience. In his book Fifty Places to Play Golf Before You Die, Chris Santella includes Ugolino as one of the fifty places to play.

FLORENCE

Rennaissance, Power, Intrigue and David

Cradle of the Renaissance, romantic, enchanting and utterly irresistible, Florence (Firenze) is a place to feast on world-class art and gourmet Tuscan cuisine. Few cities are so compact in size or so packed with extraordinary art and architecture masterpieces at every turn. The urban fabric of this small city, on the banks of the Arno river in northeastern Tuscany, has hardly changed since the Renaissance and its narrow cobbled streets are a cinematic feast of elegant 15th- and 16th-century palazzi (palaces), medieval candle-lit chapels, fresco-decorated churches, marble basilicas and world-class art museums brimming with paintings and sculptures by Botticcelli, Michelangelo et al. Unsurprisingly, the entire city centre is a Unesco World Heritage Site.

Food and wine which is sourced locally, seasonally and sustainably is the holy trinity and Florentines share an enormous pride in their culinary tradition. Their city, surrounded by winerich hills, is a gourmet paradise where eating and drinking exceedingly well is mandatory. Be it a traditional bowl of earthy ribollita (bean, bread and veg soup), a tripe panino at a family-run food truck or a blue T-bone steak served in a market trattoria unchanged since 1915, dining in Florence is timeless and memorable. Raw cuisine, fish bistros, craft cocktails and the dazzling creativity of modern young Tuscan chefs add contemporary edge.



ROYAL LA BAGNAIA GOLF RESORT

Design: Robert Trent Jones Jr. Ranking: Italy 25

Situated less than a 30-minute drive from the centre of Siena, a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site, the 18-hole layout at Royal Golf La Bagnaia is Robert Trent Jones Jnr's first design in Tuscany, and it's one of three Italian courses currently in the American architect's portfolio.

The course is set out as an "inland links" within an enormous, rolling estate where fairways are positioned around the sparkling waters of five attractive lakes. Indeed, many of the feature holes on both nines are set out beside these attractive water hazards.

In the portfolio of IMG Prestige, the course promises to be one of the finest in Europe, and the combination of the high quality care from IMG and the team at Bagnaia, the irreplacable Tuscan culture, and the rolling hills of Siena this could become one of the best of the best.

Rome, Italy

OLGIATA WEST

Design: C.K. Cotton and Frank Pennink Ranking: Italy: 5 | Europe 98

All 27 holes at Olgiata are set in sumptuous parkland surroundings where the terrain is mildly undulating and fairways are separated by avenues of magnificent mature trees. The two 9-hole loops of the West course fan out from the clubhouse in opposite directions with many of the well-bunkered holes gently doglegging left or right.

The club co-hosted the Italian Open with Roma Acquasanta in 1973. More recently, Ian Poulter claimed the Italian Open title here in 2002 and Bernd Wiesberger prevailed in 2019. The club has twice hosted the World Cup; the first time in 1968 when the Canadian two-man team of Al Balding and George Knudson lifted the trophy; and the second occasion in 1984, with the Spanish winners from two years previous, José Maria Cañizares and José Rivero, triumphing again. In 2010 Jim Fazio performed an extensive renovation when fifteen holes were modified.

ANCIENT ROME AND THE VATICAN

Controversy, Conspiracy, and the 1000 year empire

The Vatican City and both Ancient and Modern Rome are inextricably linked with conspiracy, scandal, faith and security. The smallest country in the world is nestled within the city of Rome, and with only 825 inhabitants it is the most visited country.

Discover the best of the Vatican city with a guided visit to the vatican museum and St Peters Basillica. admire the paintings of Michelangelo, Raphael, Titan, and see the seat of power that governs the faith of several billion Catholics around the world. Also stop by the ATM and withdraw some vatican money in Latin! The Institute for Works of Religion or Vatican Bank, is a financial agency in the Vatican. It has multilingual ATMs and is the only one in the world to offer instructions in Latin.

After Lunch take a tour of the ancient roman sites, including the colloseum, Forum and the Palatine hills.



ACQUASANTA (Alternate Course)

Design: Unknown Ranking: Italy: 6

It was back in 1903 that a number of like-minded, golf-mad British expatriates created the first Italian golf course – along with a cricket pitch and tennis court – at Roma Acquasanta, to the south east of the Eternal City. Over 100 years later, Roma Acquasanta Golf Club remains not only one of the most prestigious clubs in the country and a wonderfully atmospheric place to play golf, but also Italy's oldest golf course. Laid out over an enchanting parkland landscape, with views of the Via Appia Antica, Aqua Claudius arches and ancient tomb of Cecilia Metella in the background, Roma Acquasanta seems suspended in a time warp with the course and its surroundings standing still as the modern world goes by.

The course plays fairly tightly, with trees, the meandering river Almone and intelligently placed bunkers coming into play at many holes. A prime example is the 430-yard par four 17th which is played downhill to a hole protected by a bunker to the front right. Before the green complex, however, there are not one, but two streams running across the fairway, the second of which continues laterally along the left side of the putting surface.

LGT golf sells the program to other travel companies for resale as well as to end clients.

PARTIES: In these terms and conditions, "you" or "passenger" or "participant" refers to the person booking, purchasing or travelling on the tour, and to individuals travelling as part of that person's reservation. "We" or "us" refers to LGT Solutions s.r.o trading as LGT Golf. LGT Golf offers the travel package and enters in the terms and conditions listed in this brochure and our website www.lgtgolf.com.

DEPOSIT & FINAL PAYMENT: To make a reservation, please contact LGT Golf on bookings@lgtgolf.com or +43 660 134 5275 A deposit of €325 per person is required at time of booking. The Alliance Pro Am Packages are required to be paid in full at the time of booking. These are non refundable, however the European Seniors Tour has indicated that they would provide a credit for another event. In addition to the tour deposit, Hotel Extra Nights require a non-refundable deposit of €50 per stateroom at the time of confirmation of hotel availability. Final payment is due no later than 100 days prior to departure; non-payment may result in the reservation being cancelled.

PRICING: Unless indicated otherwise, all brochure prices are per person in € Euro, based on double occupancy of a standard hotel room. Single rates are available for the tour at a supplement of 50%, except for suites which are 100%.
